### SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

St. Francis de Sales is a co-educational, college preparatory Catholic high school located in a traditionally working class neighborhood of Chicago known as the East Side. The parish school began in 1893 and the four-year high school has been in existence since 1937.

The students reflect the diverse social, intellectual, economic, cultural and religious make up of the area. Approximately 48% of the students are Latino, 48% of the students are African American and 4% are white. Many students are first-generation college students with approximately 55% of the students attending four-year college, 30% attending two-year college, and 15% entering into the military, technical instruction, or the workforce.

With our small student body, we are fortunate to have small class sizes. The faculty/student ratio is 1:10.

### CURRICULUM AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

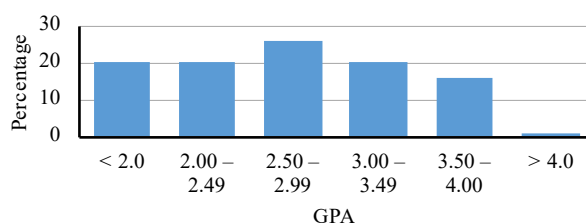
- A minimum of 24 credits is required for graduation
- St. Francis de Sales offers four AP classes, including AP US History, AP English Literature and Composition, AP English Language and Composition, and AP Biology.
- St. Francis de Sales offers eight Honors classes, including English 1, English 2, Algebra, Geometry, Algebra 2, Calculus, Biology, and Chemistry.
- The Class of 2022 only had the opportunity to pursue two years of World Language (Latin or Spanish).

### GRADING AND RANKING

- School policy eliminated class rank.
- St. Francis de Sales uses a 4.0 grading scale.
- GPA is computed using the quality points listed below. AP and Honors classes are weighted by one point. Beginning with grade nine, all subjects, whether passes or failed, are included in the computation.
- The school year is divided into semesters. Grades are recorded on the transcript and GPA is computed in January and June.
